

## Feedback to Laoshi Debby Yang's Chinese lesson

My name is Jenny Chang from South Korea, and I and my son Daniel(his Chinese name is Youcheung) have been studying Chinese with Debby since last September.

I've been married to a Chinese man more than 7 years, but my Chinese skill was rather dreadful when I met Ms. Debby last year. I had taken many Chinese classes (both group and private lessons) when I lived in Japan, but wasn't able to continue studying longer term.
